




ARTIST SPOTLIGHT



Frida KAHLO

Frida Kahlo was born on 6th July 1907. She made many self-portraits while she lay in bed following a serious bus accident when she was 18. Her artwork contains lots of symbolism including pain, death and love. Frida Kahlo is highly recognisable, in particular for her monobrow which she was very proud of. At age 6 she contracted polio, leaving her with physical damage to her right leg and she was teased at school being called 'peg leg'. Frida quelled her loneliness with an array of exotic animals that made their way into her paintings including spider monkeys and parakeets. Frida Kahlo made around 200 paintings before she died in 1954 age 42, but her legacy lives on.

Did you know: At age 22, Frida married Diego Rivera; another famous artist!
