Why not challenge your child to a maths duel??






CHILDREN IN NEED

A SNAPSHOT OF LEARNING

GERALD THE GIRAFFE



Eagles Class had a special PSHE session this week with a visitor from **SCARF** (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship). The children learnt how to keep their brains healthy through good sleep, exercise, a balanced diet and time away from screens. They also talked about different types of drugs, including medicines and harmful substances, and why it's important to look after their bodies and minds.

A key part of the lesson was practising how to say "no" confidently and how to support friends to make safe choices too.

Eagles Class impressed us with their mature ideas and sensible discussions about staying safe and healthy.

Owls Class also enjoyed a special visit from SCARF this week, with a workshop all about "My Wonderful Body."

The children learned how amazing their bodies are and what they need to stay healthy and safe. They talked about the things that give them energy, such as healthy food, water, sleep and exercise, and how these help them to play, learn and grow. They also thought about ways to keep themselves safe, including knowing who they can talk to if they feel worried or unsure.

A real highlight of the session was meeting Harold the giraffe, who helped the children think about how to be kind to their bodies and to each other. Owls Class listened carefully, joined in with actions and discussions, and showed a brilliant understanding of how to look after their "wonderful bodies."





A SNAPSHOT OF LEARNING

OUT OF THIS WORLD!







Goshawks have been busy this week creating scale models of the planets in our Solar System using plasticine. The children carefully measured and compared the relative sizes, quickly noticing just how tiny Mercury and Mars are next to the giant Jupiter and Saturn! This hands-on activity helped them visualise the huge differences between the planets and use mathematical skills to compare scale. The classroom has been full of curiosity and teamwork as Goshawks brought space science to life.


LETTERS FROM KENYA



Sparrowhawks class have taken part in a very special project this term, writing letters to children at Raap School in Kenya.

In their letters, the children described themselves, our school and what a typical day looks like here, helping them to think about how daily life and education can be different around the world.

Like many schools in Africa, Raap School has no internet, very few learning resources and a very different way of life. The Kenyan children have written back with their own letters and have drawn beautiful pictures of their favourite animals from Kenya. Sparrowhawks were excited to read their replies and compare experiences.







they might be hiding to keep warm. There was *lots* of walking and plenty of fresh air, and the children's energy never seemed to run out. The Arboretum was a perfect place to see how the trees are changing with the seasons, and the children enjoyed collecting their favourite leaves to compare. 






SPECIAL EVENTS


