We couldn't be prouder of them all.




WORLD AWARENESS

LATVIA "Sveiki '



Over several days, children from across the school have joined the Stroud Book festival at the Subscription Rooms to dive into the magic of stories and storytelling.





A special highlight was a visit from Vijay, Lilah, and Nathaniel in Goshawks who kindly shared stories from their own celebrations outside of school.


KNEX CHALLENGE!
